With the support of our partner, Caritas Nepal, Laxmi joined a child's club at her school where she was encouraged to resume her education. Through the child's club, Laxmi developed the skills and confidence to become a leader, advocating for clearn water taps at her school.

Laxmi is now excelling in her studies and working towards her dream of becoming a civil engineer. She continues to be involved in the child's club, serving as an adviser and mentoring the next generation of young leaders at her old school.

Reading



Neading together with your child has many benefits - building a bigger vocabulary, 🎑 🚅 encouraging stronger discussions and developing confidence. Having your child read to you is a safe and nurturing way for children to practice whilst learning themselves.

Each week children will receive a reader in their homework as well as having the opportunity to borrow from the Library fortnightly. When reading these books at home with your child, you can model the reading for them as well as listening to them read independently. By reading for and with your child, you are showing them correct pace, expression and accuracy.

Also discuss the stories by asking questions such as: Who is your favourite character? Describe the setting. What do you think will happen next? Students will receive a bookmark with more questions your can use together in their homework folders.

Reading is important in all forms including on devices. It is important that we give our kids the tools to have good mental health, be happy and ready to learn.




